#### Update on Re-opening our churches

As I mentioned in this space last week, we hope it may be possible for places of worship to re-open from 4 July. I am grateful to the churchwardens who are spending a lot of time with their tape measures trying to make this work. It is amazing how big two metres is when you start to think about where people might sit.

Just to confirm there won't be an immediate return to the service pattern we had before the pandemic. Initially there is likely to be one public communion service and one public service of the word each Sunday. Some churches may also be open for private prayer, but we will let you know more when we have worked out the finer details. Meanwhile, the regular online services i.e. Sunday 11am communion services; Morning Prayer on Tuesdays and Thursdays; together with the monthly ASK and Worship & Praise services will continue.

#### Hello from ST ANDrew's FAmily Service Team

We hope you are all well. If you've not heard of STANDFAST before we are a team of people who, with Norma's help, put together the Family Service in Shrivenham every month.

We also help to organise the Christingle Service, Crib Service and Good Friday children's activities.

Lockdown has been an interesting challenge for families. Parents have had to quickly adapt to teaching their children at home. Even though most of the STANDFAST team have been (or are) teachers and teaching assistants, teaching your own children is a very different kettle of fish. I have realised that I have forgotten most of the French I learnt at school, but Google translate is very useful! I've also discovered that 10-year-old boys are much better at Year 9 IT than me!!



The schools have been fantastic providing resources, and without this I know I would have found it far more challenging. Schools of course have been open throughout providing much needed childcare for our keyworkers, however, they are now beginning to re-open in a gradual phased way to other pupils. This week saw the return of Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 students. Please pray for all the staff and children returning to school and for those making the decisions about how and when the rest will return.

STANDFAST have been trying to keep in touch with families in and around Shrivenham, mostly by Facebook. We were unable to do our usual Easter Garden making activity on Good Friday so instead we encouraged people to make their own at home.



This Sunday we are hoping to put a whole family service onto our <u>Facebook</u> page.

It is requiring me to learn new IT skills editing together videos the children have sent me but hopefully we'll pull it off! If it is successful, we will do one next month too.

Either Isaiah 40:12-17. 27-31

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the LORD, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burntoffering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness. 
