#### Ashbury Churchyard 'Spring Clean'



Thank you all so much for another fantastic spring clean of the old and new Churchyards on Saturday 25th March. What was particularly appreciated was that our team this year comprised so many "younger" couples many of whom have been in the village less than two years. Their agility, stamina and strength are a great help.

This year, whilst it was a consolidation of the work that had been achieved in previous years, there were an amazing number of twigs and branches to be cleared following the recent gales. Barrow load after barrow load were seen crossing to Charlie's bonfire.

Something we had not previously tackled was the southern boundary of the old Churchyard especially around the badger holes including removing the arisings from the holes falling onto the back footpath.

Also tackled this year for the first time in some years was the hedgerow on the right of the footpath going into the new churchyard. In addition, we continued for a second year to extend our works in the Church car park.

A real community effort. Even the weather was kind!

#### Wednesday Study Groups from 19th April

We are offering two programmes for the five weeks from 19th April.

We believe this course is more suited to face-to-face discussions and, if numbers are sufficient, we will meet in St Andrew's rather than the vicarage so please let Norma know if you are thinking about coming along. We believe it will be particularly helpful to PCCs who will be discussing the implications of any decisions made by the national church in the years ahead.

The choice of 1 John for the mornings was prayerfully made: it is John who tells us that "Those who live in love, live in God and God lives in them" and also "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." We want the evening discussions to be grounded in that love, even where we disagree on complicated and sensitive matters, so both groups will hold each other in prayer. #### LITURGY OF THE PALMS

#### **GOSPEL Matthew 21:1-11**

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey. The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

#### PSALM Psalm 118:1-2, 19-end

R This is the day that the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it.

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures for ever. Let Israel now proclaim, "His mercy endures for ever." R

Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter them; I will offer thanks to the Lord

"This is the gate of the Lord; whoever is righteous may enter." R I will give thanks to you, for you answered

and have become my salvation. The same stone which the builders rejected

has become the chief corner-stone. R

This is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes. On this day the Lord has acted; we will rejoice and be glad in it. R

#### FIRST READING Isaiah 50:4-9a

A reading from the book of the prophet

The servant of the LORD said: The Lord GOD has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens - wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord GOD has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord GOD helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord GOD who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
